

## Running Hot & Cold

On Nov 18, a group of Porsche enthusiasts gathered at RMG Enterprises to learn about heating and air conditioning systems in Porsches. Bob Grigsby presented an overview of various systems starting with 356's through 911 and Boxster versions. Porsche RMG experts Dan Heinrichs, and Dan Leitner were also present to answer questions.

Heaters have advanced from the most crude early 356 system that deflected engine cooling air (along with fumes and oil smells) into the cabin. Later systems incorporated heat exchangers that use a shroud system around the exhaust pipes to produce warm air for the cabin. This shroud system is primarily 911 based, although there were some rare euro 356 "fresh air system" models made with heat exchangers. These are expensive if one can find them (but so are 356's). If your heat exchangers need replacement, consider the SSI units – very good quality.

With any of the early systems it's good preventative maintenance to have the heating cables, which control the valves that direct the air flow, lubricated occasionally to prevent binding and possible damage to components.

In the years '89 - '90, cars with climate control appeared that have replaced control cables with computer controlled servos controlling various flaps and fans for the comfort of the driver and passengers. The good news is there are no cables to bind and be serviced. The bad news is sometimes the servo's have to be replaced. The climate control box also controls the system fans and can apply creative control of components to optimize the comfort of passengers.



RMG enterprises is located in this nondescript commercial building. It may be hard to find, but plenty of Porsche pushers manage to locate the place.

Air conditioning is more interesting because it's much harder to implement than heating. It requires the engine to drive a compressor that puts energy into the coolant. Coolants are some variant of fluorocarbons, sometimes called Freon (a DuPont trademark). (Thomas Midglev developed Chlorofluorocarbons (CFC) in 1928 as a replacement for ammonia (NH3), chloromethane (CH3Cl), and sulfur dioxide (SO2) refrigerants that were toxic, occasionally killing people.) After the condenser turns the compressed coolant into a liquid it is piped to the evaporator where heat from the surrounding air is absorbed. This provides the cabin

cooling. How much cooling you get depends on many things, starting with the engineer's choice of how much power to put into the AC system. Do you want to go fast, or be cool? Our answer is usually the Deion Sanders choice - both. Besides sucking bower from the engine that ends up as more heat in the engine compartment, the various components require space and weight.

Late model cars can control the AC compressor stroke length to conserve energy. The original coolant in auto AC systems was R-12, dichlorodifluoromethane. This has been banned as an ozone depleting substance and replaced by R-134a, tetrafluorethane – no chlorine, so no ozone depletion, but now considered a greenhouse gas. Either one must be recycled by ~ \$15 K machines. and can be re-used as needed. R-12 systems can be

converted to R-134 use, but there will be a loss of cooling power, so Bob does not recommend it. When converting. different hoses, oil, and fittings are required, so it's complicated. R-12 is still available, although expensive.

Coolant level in a fully charged system will measure 65-70 psi with the engine off, at room temperature. At 40 bsi, it is low and coolant should be added. When operating, 30 psi is normal on the low side, and 180-200 psi on the high side. It's important to keep air and moisture operations include complete evacuation before re-filling with coolant and oil if




out of the system, so some service Bob Grigsby interacts with several of the session's attendees.

required. Moisture in the system freezes at the evaporator, blocking cooling until it melts, then the process starts over again.

Inside, the facility seems clean, well lit and modern. This guy must know what he's doing!

Cooling improvements - If your evaporator leaks and has to be replaced, consider replacing the original equipment Behr unit with the RennAire after-market evaporator, because it improves cooling. The center air vent can be replaced on some 911's to improve air flow. Beware of other "exotic" coolants because if it does not fit the R-12 or R-134a profile, your service provider may not be able to deal with it.


