

## POST POSITIONS

I was watching a little TV with Debbie last month when I saw a solicitation for charitable donations to help send shoes to children in Africa. The pitch was accompanied by the usual images of the dark continent's childhood poverty with heavy emphasis on bare feet, bloody feet and how shoes will help stave off disease. The message was that ten thousand pairs of Crocs (the Twenty-First Century's equivalent to Holland's wooden clogs, made completely of plastic and manufactured in bright colors) had been donated and funds were needed to transport the shoes to where they were needed.



A little research reveals that the shoes were donated by the Baptist World Alliance and it appears that they were made from recycled old and/or defective shoes and created solely for the purpose of being donated to charitable programs.

My initial reaction was as cynical as usual, but after a little thought and investigation, I determined that there really is a humanitarian benefit to providing these shoes. With large areas with little or no sanitation, hookworm appears to be problematic and can be picked up through bare feet. The problem I have is that if you've ever seen a pair of Crocs, you couldn't help thinking, as I do, that they are pretty impractical to be an individual's primary footwear. Couple this with the image of impoverished children walking around in rags and brightly colored plastic shoes and the image becomes pretty incongruous.

The Croc brand strikes me as being an extremely faddish type of product and I can't help but wonder if the glow is off the fad and the shoes were donated as a means of getting one last gasp of publicity and interest for the product as the company winds down its production and sheds some excess inventory by donating it to African charities. This would make great business sense, not just because of the benefits, tax and other, derived here at home, but also because they are potentially creating a new market for themselves should the fad catch on in Africa.

But then again, maybe someone at Crocs just said, "Hey, guys... wouldn't it be nice of us to give 10,000 pairs of shoes to Africa?" I suppose that such things happen in this world, but not on my block.





We had a great showing at Don's AutoWer ks on April 19 – about 30 LPR/PCA members along with 15 or so from the 912 club braved the weather for the Saturday 9 AM event. It was nice to see Don still at it as he had restored the engine of my previous Porsche ride, a 1976 912E, some 15+ years ago.

This session consisted of two parts: proper "Detailing" of your second love and "Preventive maintenance" of same (sounds familiar!)

A. The first session was presented by Mike Lee of Detailing Dynamics. We learned a lot and, most amazingly, with Jim's help, he was able to make Jim & Jen Bryant's car appear 10 years younger thus appreciating it almost as much as Google appreciated on Friday

(19.99%) — well done!

Key points we learned:

- $\begin{array}{cccc} 1. & 100\,\% & of & th\,e \\ participants wash their own cars! \\ Can't afford the washing after \\ the maintenance expenses! \end{array}$
- 2. Use of "shampoo" vs. "chemical" cleaners use nothing but the gentlest. Use a cleaner with Ph 8.5-9.5 (Basic) 7.0 is neutral < 7 Ph is acidic, thus corrosive.
- 3. Wash the dirtiest section first like the wheels,

especially if you use a power washer. Remove all dirt first with a strong water stream.

4. On wheels use 3 types of brushes. A large brush for tires and outside of rims, a spoke brush to get to the tight spaces and a "basting" brush to get to the wheel

nuts cavities, etc. No metal parts of the brushed can be exposed.

- 5. Use synthetic polish Carnauba is a natural wax to be used if you have a garage queen that is not exposed often to daylight. Use Synthetic wax on daily drivers it lasts 2-3 months and will not wash off!
- 6. Use two buckets of water one with plain water, the other with soap. Use one cleaning mitten with soap with a back and forth motion (no circular motion) on the vertical car surfaces and use a second one for the sides! Rinse the mitt in clear water before dipping again into the soap solution to keep the grime away from the paint.
- 7. Use soap with a lubricant if washing in the sun. This will prevent water spots! (Use dishwasher soap if you want to strip the old wax away!)
- 8. Use "clay" to remove small "bumps" (to exfoliate the paint). Flatten the clay, and use a back and forth motion; fold and reflatten the clay as soon as you notice grime on the clay surface. Keep on doing this. Always use clay before waxing!
- 9. You can use WD-40 to remove tree sap. Remove "bird gifts" ASAP apply ample water before wiping with wet towel. (We all carry spray bottles with water in our cars just for that!!). If not removed you will have a nice stamp of approval on the paint for a long time.

- 10. We observed a demonstration with a pressure washer (1200 PSI) wheels first 3 brushes and bucket of soap and clear water. Jim finished his car after he was shown how to do it! Great job!

- 6. Even Jim Bryant won something .... What is the world coming to?
- C. Tech session by Don Wise with many wise inputs!

Here are the tips and suggestions by Don based on XX years of personal experience – and the things he

forgot were quickly supported by Rolf, his expert technician

- 1. Correct tire pressure is critical for good fuel mileage, good tire wear and safety especially in low profile tires– get an accurate gauge!
  - 2. Nitrogen for tires is nice (larger molecules leak out at slower rate)
- 3. Wiper blades keep them under observation. Be careful when changing your wiper blades, the wiper arms are spring loaded and can break windshields if they hit the glass windshield's are pricy!
- 4. Wheel nut wrench get one with long lever arm and AL socket liner.
- 5. Shock check them Billstein will rebuild yours' for free!!
- 6. Power steering reservoir filter need replacement @ 60K miles
- 7. Air filters by K & N should not be used on later cars they contaminate the "Mass air flow sensor" (\$\$\$) and mess up your emissions, Check engine light, etc.

- 8. Engine mounts on Boxster are a Porsche slip up 4th redesign has been released. Keep your eye on them only \$160 each.
- 9. Brake flush every 2 years. Cheaper then a new ABS pump, etc. especially on 964 & 993s. Also exercise your ABS keep those juices (fluids) flowing to flush out the pump.
- 10. CHF 11S (Pentosin) is used in PS and (?) on later cars careful as it is a great paint melting liquid!



- 11. Use Super Blue brake fluid on race vehicle and Super Dot on regular drivers.
- 12. Use Swepco 502 additive in your oil for Zinc and Phosphorus it improves lubrication. Don uses Swepco 306 oil and has used Mobil 1 plus 502 when oil changes are performed. He also spoke about the use of fuel additives like Swepco 503, or Chevron's Techron. These, when added to the gas tank, keep fuel injectors, carbs and intake valves clean and will result in a better running engine. Also

recommended is the use of a good quality gasoline.

Vintage cars (pre 1972) should use SL oils (for vintage cars). SM spec oils have significantly less amounts of zinc and phosphorus.

- 13. Use of 0w-40 Weight oil is specified to meet a EPA/DOT fuel mileage spec but can make some engines smoke. Use of 15w40 or 15w50 is a better choice!
- 14. A/C a can/pound of R-12 is about \$80. One can replace R-12 with Freeze 12 which costs <\$20 per pound. But system should be purged prior to replacement.
- 15. R134a presently used in cars will soon be replaced with ??? Stock up now with a few cans in case your system is a little porous!
- 16. CV joints have them repacked @ 100K miles. New ones are \$450 per axle! We saw 2 "dry" CVs that had to be replaced.
- 17. Coolant use the Porsche stuff only but replace every 4-5 years nothing lasts a lifetime. Check those belts inside and out!

- 18. Window washer fluid don't buy the 99c brand at Kragen. It turns to Jell-O use an additive (Rapid Windshield Cleaner \$2).
- 19. You can purchase a Maintenance/Repair CD for Boxsters, etc. for under \$30. Slightly smaller than the multi volume manuals!

We concluded the session at 11:45 AM. Some went to admire the two "kit cars" - one a Spyder the other a Speedster replica – these can be purchased from Green Rides in Campbell on Railway Ave. Nice vehicle with 1900cc (?) modified VW engines. These will also be sold as 100% electric with about a 50 mile range. Once you run out of juice,

your wife has to push!

Overall it was an informative and interesting event. Thanks to the organizers, to Don and Mike for their presentations and to Green Rides for demonstrations of their kit cars.
