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Editor's Letter

This starts the club's 40th year and my second year as Editor. I wanted to give the *Prieta Post* more magazine quality and style. In doing so I have been battling against a headwind as it takes a great deal of time, and as we found now creates additional expense. Producing the multi-page layouts consumes space by adding pages; also the postal regulations have changed during the year adding requirements for proper mailing, all causing additional expense. Key now is also that the printing of the *Prieta Post* is also dependant upon its size.

I am happy however to see that a majority of our participating member, the 30-40 that actually show-up at events, still like receiving the printer version. So, since we are going to continue to print and mail the *Prieta Post* the expense must be considered, an area where I have complete control. In that regard, limiting the size of the Prieta Post makes complete sense.

For 2010 the club and the individual members of LPR will be burdened with a couple of additional expenses, the 40th Anniversary Celebration, and in February LPR must host the PCA National President's meeting. The cost of attendance is an expense to the members....I hope if you pick between the two you pick our 40th.

With this I think it will be key for our new Board to strike a balance this year with our budget; a balance between the expenses of running LPR compared to the expense to the individual members, and all with a view to new income sources along with preventing apathy among the members. Finding this balance is my hope for LPR for 2010.

I hope you have all had a happy holiday season. Happy New Year. *–Steve Mitchell*

The December Board Meeting was held on December 3, 2009 at the Round Table Pizza on Camden Ave, San Jose and was called to order at 7:03 pm by President Les Schreiber.

Other members in attendance were Paul Seidel-Smith, Peter Ridgway, Steve Mitchell, Herb Radding, Angie Reed, Dick & Mary Wallace, Tony Vanacore, Ed Tefankjian, Greg Sickal, Steve Crane, Virginia Jansen, Anne Roth, Doug Ryder, Ken & June Iles, Suzette Pangrle, Pete Siemens, John Cole, Bill & Emilie Highley.

George moved to approve the November minutes and John seconded. The minutes were approved.

Directors' Reports

President: Les Schreiber

John Reed read an amendment to the Policies & Procedures. George moved, John seconded and the motion was approved. Post publication survey, option one, no change, seven votes; option two, publish every other month, nine votes; option three, was to offer it only on-line, and send out cards got nineteen votes; option 4 was to limit it to 36 pages and got twelve votes. Considering the results of the Survey, the Board determined that a majority of the total responses were in favor of a printed Prieta Post, in other words, 28 responses in total were in favor of a printed edition, compared to 19 wanting it exclusively on-line. As a consequence and after a full discussion, the Board considered a motion by George who moved that we have minimum of 36 pages and a maximum of 48 pages, published monthly. John seconded, and the motion passed with a vote of 3 to 2 with one abstention. Emilie provided an update on the PCA board meeting upcoming in February. LPR is to host the Saturday 20th evening. Emilie is looking for entertainment ideas. For outgoing board members: be sure to hand-off the information to your replacements. Anne Roth will be the Autocross Co-Chair. The Member-at-Large will keep the perpetual trophies this coming year.

Vice-President: Jackie Mitchell

Jackie reminded us that the Awards Banquet is this Saturday, and the Gift exchange is coming up. The team met on the 40th anniversary plans. Next meeting will be at the Round Table Pizza next Tuesday at 7:00pm. Jackie sent out the recommendation for the GTG policies. Les provided feedback.
