

# Eagle's Flight Tour



### LPR takes a two-day tour to Paso Robles

ow is it that I find myself back in Paso Robles, a scant 2 weeks after being here for the Eagle's Flight Tour? There's something about never getting enough of a good thing and Paso is one of those really good things!

Kris and I have been visiting the Paso area ever since we attended an LPR tour, to San Luis Obispo, in the early '90's. The tour organizer had a friend that taught viniculture at Cal Poly and he took us to some of his favorite wineries. We joined 3 winery clubs that tour and still belong to two of them today. The area has changed quite a bit since then but is still a charming and beautiful place to enjoy the fruits of the wine makers labor.

April 24th & 25th were the dates of the most recent tour to our favorite wine country. 20 cars met at Flap Jacks restaurant on Highway 25 in Tres Pinos. We arrived as everyone was just finishing up. The drivers meeting was held in the parking lot of a small church just down the road. Paul and Nanci handed out route instructions and filled us in on what we would be doing this weekend. The weather was fine for top down motoring and we were soon on our way heading south. Highway 25 is one of the



more scenic roads cutting through the central valley. It runs parallel to the Calaveras Fault line. The road winds through the foothills and is a Porsche drivers delight. We took the cutoff to King City and made a short pit stop for fuel and munchies.

From here we took Jolon Road that passes through Fort Hunter Liggett. The fields in this area were filled with spring flowers. Poppies, Lupine and Lavender were like colorful blankets covering the hills. Soon we were up in the hills looking down on beautiful Lake Nacimiento, with its 165 miles of coastline. The views were as breathtaking as the roads and all too quickly we were heading down the mountain and heading for Paso Robles.



Our first winery stop was Eagle's Castle, a stone fortress that is a recent addition to the Paso wineries. It even has a moat surrounding the castle! We entered through two towering wooden doors to find a warm and inviting interior. No dungeon in sight. As we weren't scheduled for our lunch for another half hour, we opted to visit a nearby winery with our neighbors, Mary Beth and Damian. This was their first PCA tour and they wanted to see what they were getting into by selecting LPR! They are also home winemakers and Kris and I were eager to sample some of their favorite wineries. Booker Winery was a stones throw from the castle, so we made a quick visit for some tasting. Booker makes very little wine compared to many of the other local wineries. You have to be on their allocation list to even get some of their offerings. We bought a bottle of dry rose simply labeled "Pink". At 15% alcohol, it was no Mateus. Damian on the other hand was stuffing their Boxster S with as much wine as would fit! We made a hasty run back to the castle just in time for our lunch seating. Paul and Nanci had made arrangements with the winery, for us to have lunch in the Crown Room.



We were seated at long tables in a period correct grand ballroom with vaulted ceilings, stone walls, huge chandeliers and arched windows overlooking the vineyard. Wine tasting was \$5.00 with lunch, and consisted

of over a dozen wines. Service was leisurely, so lunch took much longer than anticipated but the endless tasting more than made up for the delay. When the food arrived, it was very tasty and well prepared and very welcome. To their credit, the winery comped all the tasting fees and even a few lunches. Last to get served were also presented with a free bottle of wine. Someone here knows a thing or two about customer service.



While the group headed to the Adelaide Inn, to relax and get ready for dinner, Kris and I followed Mary Beth and Damian to some of the wineries they wanted to visit. John and Angie joined us as well. It was nice to visit wineries we had never been to before. We have our regular winery stops and love visiting with the tasting room personnel, so it was a treat to leave the choices up to someone else. We got to try some great wines and have added a few more stops to future visits.

Dinner was going to be a bit early for us, seeing as we had finished lunch so late, so we stayed out tasting until most of the wineries had closed. Mary Beth and Damien were staying at the Hampton, so John and Angie followed us back to the Inn for our next surprise of the day. If you've ever stayed at the Adelaide Inn, in the past,

it was an older motel that had seen better days. We weren't expecting much but it was only one night, so what the heck. When we arrived, we were given rooms in a new complex that was recently constructed in back of the original buildings. This was one of the nicest rooms we've had in Paso, short of a high end B&B. The room was clean, spacious and had every amenity you could ask for. We were pleasantly surprised. After a bit of a rest John and Angie joined us for dinner at Big Bubb's Bad BBQ, site of a past LPR Paso dinner.

Food is fine and the waitresses lock you in a jail cell and serve your food. Beer comes in 64 ounce glasses and by the time you're done, you can't remember what the heck you ate anyway! The rest of the group had dinner at Cool Hand Luke's and later went to a Hot Spring for some hot tub therapy.



The next morning we collected our \$5.00 off coupons and headed over to Margie's Diner for breakfast. Paul had reserved four tables; so we'd all have space. Breakfast is huge! There must have been a pound of potatoes, fighting for space on my plate, with the eggs and bacon. Mary Wallace ordered a fruit bowl that could have been Carmen Miranda's headpiece. It was a massive assortment of fruit.

Everyone left full and happy. We waddled back to the Inn to gather our things and check out. Paul and Nanci had more in store for us.



For as many times as we've been to Paso, there always seems to be something we've never seen before. Paul took us to the Estrella War Birds Museum, near the Paso Airport. Here they have a collection of military aircraft, from props to jets, used in three wars as well as numerous military artifacts including an FA/18 flight simulator. We were given a fascinating personal tour by one of the curators. Just when we thought we'd seen it all, we were treated to the Woodland Automotive Display Building housing a collection of automotive and racing history. Midget, sprint, super modified and vintage classics were artfully displayed. We were joined by Don Woodland, whose collection was on display, who answered questions and added a personal touch to our visit.



Some folks needed to head home but some of us followed Paul and Nanci to Tobin James Winery for a little hair of the dog. I really didn't expect much as the winery looks like a western town Hollywood set but the wines were excellent and Paul negotiated a 15% discount for the group. We picked up some delicious blends and a nice peppery Zin. Another nice surprise. What remained of the group continued on to Eberle Winery for a tour of the caves and some tasting. Kris and I had some wine shipments to pick-up, at a couple of wineries, so we bid the group goodbye and took off on our own.

Now.... Why am I back in Paso? My neighbor has been a Porsche fan all his life. He's a German transplant and is taller than John Reed! Makes Porsche ownership difficult. He's found that with a little bit of adjusting, he can fit in a 993. We flew to San Diego to pick-up his 1995 993 and have stopped in Paso to "rest". I guess I'll have to bring him to a couple of wineries tomorrow, just so he gets the whole experience. Look for him and his family on future tours and Autox.

Paul and Nanci did a fantastic job planning and executing this tour to Paso Robles. It was great to experience new wineries and especially the aircraft and automotive displays. As always, it's the people that ultimately make the day and you couldn't have asked for a better mix. Thanks all for a fantastic weekend.

These include prime rib, New York steak, baby back ribs, filet mignon, to name a few. It also has a great selection of seafood like grilled shrimp and tasty clam chowder. This restaurant is proud to be pretty self sufficient: it does some beer brewing, and it operates its own meat cutting, processing plant and food service distribution center. They call themselves, "the coolest joint in town." We must just have to agree!



We then headed over to River Oaks Hot Spring & Spa after dinner to relax in the mineral hot springs. River Oaks offers both indoor and outdoor spas that overlook the magnificent rolling hills of Paso Robles. 
