


Autocross Newbie

"How much do tires cost!?!" And other impressions of a 1st time visit to an LPR Autocross.

After lunch and The Rocky Point tour, I couldn't help but point out to Jacqueline that we were only a few blocks away from the Zone 7 Autocross event at the Marina Airport. It was early afternoon so I managed to make a good case to stop by "just to see what an autocross was like". If you drive a Porsche and you've never been to a PCA sponsored autocross, you've missed something! If you're an LPR member, you would expect the same Good Time Region approach to AX as we do everything else. No disappointment here.

First impressions as we cruised up to the gate was somewhat intimidating. There is this very big (to me) coned off course right next to the entrance drive. As a newbie, I didn't know the difference in cone colors so it seemed we were driving right next to the cars running the course. As we're cruising slowly (15 MPH per instructions) toward the parking area, it felt like the cars on the course were going really fast. There were lots of cars, seemly parked everywhere, all with numbers on the doors. Fortunately, our Prez (Les) spotted us driving up and gave us directions to parking. First lesson: you park in the Paddock area away from the course but not in front of a stack of tires, coolers, lawn chairs and other various flotsam people removed from their cars. Most of the spaces in the Paddock were filled along with large and small trailers for hauling race cars. The equipment and other gear the serious autocrossers bring was amazing. Turns out most people just show up and drive but a few SCCA racing teams also join the event! Really cool thing was that it all gave you the impression that you were a participant at a Laguna Seca event as oppose to a spectator.



As we approached the course near the Timing trailer, we were greeted in typically friendly LPR fashion. Lots of friends and people we know from the club as well as helpful and informative people from GGR and the other regions within Zone 7. Someone actually came down from Reno!

Second lesson: the cars getting ready to run the course are staged (on grid) in something called a Chevron. The name is obvious when you see the rows of cars parked at 45 degree angles, all facing the same direction. The Grid Master directs these cars to the starting line. All very organized. All very safe. When you're not running the course, you park in the paddock. When it's your turn to run, you move your car into the Chevron, put on your helmet and wait for your turn.


Watching the cars on the course was definitely fun. Jacqueline was quickly engaged. Especially after a friendly GGR'er showed us the course map and pointed out some of the driving strategies. Second cool impression was the variety of cars running the course. Daily drivers, old and new, some cars clearly only used for AX. Lots of 911s, Boxsters, Caymens, 944's, and 914's along with a scattering of Mini Coopers, a Corvette, Miatas and others. I expected Porsches but not the number of other cars. An SCCA prepped RX 7 driven by Teresa Neidel set the fastest time we saw at 37+ seconds where everyone else was in the 40 to 50 second range. Jacqueline couldn't resist pointing out the "girl" was killing the boys, time wise.

Meanwhile, I'm borrowing a helmet because one of the AX Instructors has convinced me that I should ride with him in a demonstration run. Wait, is ride over already? That was fun! 46 seconds? Holy S___! And the "girl" ran 37 in a Miata! I'm starting to get a feel for technique and skill. It's not the car, it's the driver.

Last impressions: I'm thinking I need to start coming out for these things. I can get a helmet and scrub off a little rubber. I can do this! And Jacqueline is now thinking "How much do your tires cost?" And a helmet? And what else as you get involved? Fortunately our illustrious Autocross Chairwoman, Anne, is also coaching Jacqueline: "You just keep track of all the things he buys and make sure you get an equal spending allowance". Helmet, for now, LPR has loaners.

I'll probably be taking it easy on my first couple of runs next month. Saving the tires, you know.






