# Autocross Ground School

LPR Autocrossers and newbies learn how to have fun.

n Saturday March 12th, Jon Lazarus opened the doors to Borelli Motorsports to host Anne Roth's Autocross (AX) Ground School. About 40 LPR members showed up for the event with both experienced LPR AX trophy winners and newbies that we hope to see join the LPR AX experience this season.





Our first agenda item was to view the LPR AX trailer that had been cleaned and labeled with LPR logos and Borelli sponsor logos. Jon and Borelli did a fantastic job to revive our old trailer and people will know LPR has arrived when we are in Marina.

Anne's program covered not the details of auto dynamics but rather the AX experience and how LPR conducts the event. This included the details around timing and grid control, what to bring, what to expect, the particulars of tech inspection, and responsibilities as a worker and flag person. The focus was on how to make the most of the event and have fun.

Anne also talked about how to run the AX, how timing is measured, and what happens when you go off-course or hit cones. My favorite hand out was the listing of AX excuses, including a list of notorious and legendary excuses, as to why you failed to have a fast run or beat someone else in your class....these excuses ran from the common "I was tired" to the notorious attributed to our new member Larry Sharp: "My car is old technology" and Bill Charron's: "I

can't get any heat in my tires."

Also Bill Charron brought his notebook PC and helped attendees "class" their cars. It is not a simple matter as modifications change the AX character of a car giving it advantages that may move it up a class. For example, if you add certain suspension components or race tires you can expect points to be added that may move you to a faster class. All this is to insure a level playing field so that cars and drivers compete fairly.

Jon and Borelli made sure we had coffee and a beautiful assortment



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of muffins, bagels, and fruit as soon as we arrived. After the class, lunch was catered by Kristina Borelli's catering company called, Simply Stunning: www. simplystunningweddingsandevents. com. Anne also brought a batch of her famous "Santa Cruz Mountain" brownies and the mixings for her special margaritas. ..... Yum!

After lunch Dave conducted a short Tech Session covering suspension and tire set-ups as they relate to 911's and Boxsters. The cars explored on the lifts were Anne's 912 and President Ed's Boxster, two cars with much different suspension designs but with owners who want to achieve the same thing when they autocross...the best time in their class.



With all this AX and car dynamics discussion along with wonderful catered food, brownies, and drinks, I think LPR had another successful event. I want to give a BIG thank you to our great instructor Anne, to our gracious host Jon and Borelli Motorsports, and Simply Stunning Catering for this event.








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# Tech Session at Bascom Trim and Upholstery story Scott Seamon

to the end) awaited 20 LPR'ers at Bascom Upholstery on a rainy, cold Saturday morning, February 19th. General Manager John Wardell and his staff welcomed everyone into the warm lobby for some overview remarks and then led us all on a tour of the shop. Joining us were Owner John Bascom's sons, Perry and Ryan Bascom, Darryl Smith, Sound Specialist and Greg MacDonald, Detailing Manager. Building on last year's tech session, John used this day to introduce everyone to the businesses' new website, www. bascomtrim.com and the full range of auto services they offer. Bascom Upholstery is a full service repair shop for everything on the inside of your car including seats, dash, trim, tops, headliners, carpet, glass and audio/video and alarms - you name it, they demonstrated they can do it.

The shop is a wholesaler of detailing supplies to many of the local detail shops and high end car washes. John emphasized that you should think of them for any insurance work as they are the direct connect to all our insurance carriers. Window glass is a specialty as well. John told the group that with an appointment, a driver can be in and out in one day and be given a courtesy ride to work or home. While glass can be repaired on-site by mobile services, his installer is a real pro and he wants to ensure that the adhesives set properly before subjecting the car to any jarring.

We all took a tour of the shop to see some cars in progress. They do up to 12 full restores each year, typically with one or two in progress at any one time. John showed off a classic red T-Bird that they essentially reassembled and completely outfitted the interior of. An early Black over Orange Olds Cutlass showed off the audio expertise of his audio/video/alarm specialist, Darryl.

A beautiful black Boxster was held there just so the group could see the new top with glass rear window, installed for the proud owner at a price way below the cost of the Porsche dealer price for the top alone. The glass section has a 20% smaller viewing area, but you never replace the plastic window again. And John warranties his tops for a full three years, not even prorating them as some shops do. If a seam starts to go before the end of the three years, John replaces the top without charge. This point emphasized John's commitment to service and building a loyal customer following.



A black over red Boxster was torn apart inside to address a huge amount of rainwater that had gotten into the car due to another shop's errors in installing the convertible top. John talked about this car to demonstrate how his shop is frequently called upon to "fix" the problem others can't.

John employs a craftsman who specializes in dyeing and repairing upholstery and interior surfaces. We saw a Lincoln Navigator door panel that had been seriously fractured and repaired by John's employee. A new panel is no longer available and this guy fiberglassed the panel and repaired the exterior in such a way that you really could not discern the damage. Everyone was very impressed, particularly with the way he matched the texture of the original surface and the repaired area. As we



were walking back for the detailing demo, we passed a bench seat on display upholstered in gorgeous leather, except it wasn't leather. Instead, it was "mystique vinyl," a high end alternative to leather that amazed the group for its luxurious feel.

The remainder of the session was spent learning about the range of products Bascom Trim sells and picking up on specific detailing tips. My '97 black Boxster looked great on the shop's floor having just been detailed by AJ's Auto Detailing but Ryan Bascom added some luster to it after demonstrating how to clay bar the car and apply either of two waxes; the faster Cherry Speed wax or the one-year Blueberry paste wax. Either way, wet and wring out the applicator pad, apply a small amount of wax to the pad, apply the wax in straight lines, no circles. You can go front to back, diagonal, across the car to cover the area, just don't swirl. And you don't need much. Too much only creates a slow drying, harder to remove wax residue. Use microfiber towels folded, not bunched, to remove the haze in the same way. Tip: remove the manufacturer's label from the towel; they scratch the paint. Products/methods demonstrated included: wash soaps, mitts and pads, complete wheel cleaner (spray on, wait and rinse - acid free - safe for Porsche and MBZ wheels), water sprite cloth, clay bars and Showroom Shine, cherry flash liquid and blueberry paste waxes, degreasers and aqua wax for a quick wax after washing and even before drying the car.



At the end of the tech session, the staff passed out spray bottles of 1) leather and plastic cleaner and 2) aqua wax. You had to be present to win.....Maybe John will host us again next year?

Thanks to John and his staff for a great morning session. We all drove home in the rain with products to immediately garage our cars and get them looking great again.

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


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

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# So, what is this Parado Parade Concours thing all about?

hat title question really seems to be the most common thing asked by new Parade attendees...what is this Concours thing all about? Well, I guess it might be considered one of those questions where the answer depends on your perspective. If you have an autocross perspective, then the "Q-tippers" are slightly off their rocker and the display is just a nice way to spend the day before the autocross starts (other than the race cars on display of course!). To the Rally folks, the display is a little more palatable, but if you are going to spend that much time with your car you should at least include a few calculations to correlate the speedometer with your GPS. I'm not even going to discuss the Tech Quiz only crowd...

The Concours can be as simple or as complicated as you like, from a nice display of Porsches to enjoy on a beautiful summer day to the last details of restoration perfection, and anywhere in between. The Parade Concours is the premier Concours event of the year for PCA; a truly awesome display of over 60 years of Porsche history in America and beyond. The Parade location this year is Savannah, Georgia, a charming destination city that is sure to provide

you with your fill of pralines and peanuts once you have had enough of the Concours.

For the first time in the Park's history, an automotive display will be allowed on these grounds, courtesy of the 2011 Parade Concours, Porsche Club of America members will stroll the lawns and gardens festooned with possibly the finest display of Porsches in Parade history. Reds, Blues, Yellows and Blacks will add to the

Green of Forsyth Park, as Porsches in all shapes and sizes converge on the grounds. The Monday event is open to the public and will be buzzing with activity all day long.

Featuring over a hundred cars, the Concours will display competitive vehicles in classes, divisions and groups in four major areas: Preparation, Preservation, Restoration and Performance. The crowd favorite Historic Display should feel right at home in this location as well! And if competition is not your thing, the Corral is another possibility. Several hundred Porsches will be displayed (grouped by model) in the non-competitive Corral. To join this collection of Porsches, you just need to submit a regular entry to the Parade before registration closes...but if you can't bring your Porsche and want to view the Concours, just bring yourself as this event is open to the public.

The four groups of cars are grouped in roughly the following criteria (memorize this to impress any innocent bystander at Forsyth Park that asks the "What's this Concours thing all about..." question!):

**Preparation**-This is the group comprised of mostly newer cars, they are being judged on how well prepared they are (ie-clean). There is not so much emphasis on originality as how completely free of dirt the car is, so watch out for those Q-tips!

**Preservation**-This group is the opposite of Preparation, it is reserved for cars that have been faithfully maintained and kept original over many years, so you will see mostly older Porsches here with decades of

careful care and attention. Cleanliness is not so important, but all of the original bits and pieces certainly are!

**Restoration**-This group is made up of cars that have been restored to their original condition. This time consuming process is evaluated by experienced teams of judges, some of whom actually remember what these cars looked like when they were new! Cleanliness and originality are judged, making this group a difficult proposition for entrants, so thankfully there are cars judged in Touring (top only) and Full (top and bottom of the car is judged).

**Performance**-This group of cars ranges from all out racers to modified street cars, most of them "personalized" to their owner's liking. You will see a lot of variety in this group, which is judged on cleanliness only and feature highly modified and performance oriented Porsches.

I hope that little refresher course on the Parade Competition Rules helps you spot the different groups at the Concours, and make more sense of the myriad of awards and trophies at the banquet. You can also browse the Porsche Corral and Historic Display for cars that are not competing, but certainly add a lot to the display. Feel free to come a day or so early and enjoy the prep area (air-conditioned!) in the convention center and see all the work that goes on behind the scenes of our Day at the Concours!



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### Tech Notes

In the coming months, I will try to submit interesting articles that you may find of some use. In some of them are things that happened to one of our members, or information I have received through our Porsche advisor.


### **DEAD BATTERY**

The battery: 996-997 and maybe 993. Lock the car, even if the car's parked in the garage. The reason is the computer is always searching to activate various systems which drains the battery after a week or so of the car not running. When locked, the computer rests leaving the battery less likely to drain during this time frame. Simple but effective, better than calling AAA or Porsche for a jump start.

Nothing like a dead battery at just the right moment! A battery trickle charger will ensure that the battery is always charged and ready to go. Easy and simple to use. A must if your Porsche is not driven for an extended period of time. Purchase through Automotion, Griot's Garage, Strasse, the dealer, etc. Price is around 70-80 dollars. Don Wise can also get this for you, as well as Parts Heaven.

Another point for a dead battery with an automatic transmission:

If you have a dead battery, or not enough battery power to kick over the starter and you have a Tiptronic, the simple way to release



the shift lever is: Turn the key to on. Step on the brake. Release the shift leaver to neutral. You can now easily push the car anywhere you want. This comes in handy if your Porsche is in a garage and needs to be pushed down a long driveway to get a jump start from the AAA truck or you need a tow.



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
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
