The Jelly Belly Tour



Tech Note

Trying to keep your Porsche in tip-top shape, and you come out to get into your car, and notice you have a dent or scrape in your paint job. I have discovered in the past couple of months, that is what happened to my 2002 Porsche Carrera, and have also found a solution.

There are two very reliable businesses that can take care of the problem without costing you an arm and a leg.

First, for that ding or dent- contact Joe at Dings & Dents (408) 370-3368 60 E Sunnyoaks Ave, Campbell. He also does Highlight and Bumper Refinishing as well as scratch removal. I'm not sure if he does major paint, but check with him, and let him know you are with LPR.

Second, those scrapes you have in your nice paint job, that you don't want to have the whole side of your car repainted; contact Automotive Touch-Up Company, Patrick Carr (415) 806-3214. He will come out to your house, and do the painting in your driveway or garage. He mixes all his own paint, on site, and matches completely, your color.

For reference, I had a dent put in my fender at the Funkhana and took it over to Joe at Dings and Dents and he took it out completely. We covered the scratch with my touch-up paint, but I could still see it. Then Doug Ryder gave me Patrick's number, and Patrick came out and painted, both doors, where I had a scratch. Now, you can't see either, and I didn't have to have the whole side painted. Check it out the next time you see me.



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

PROPOSED 2011 BY-LAW CHANGES

Article V: Meetings of the members Section 7 Meeting minutes

Minutes of Board meetings shall be recorded and typed by the Secretary or by such other person as may be appointed by the Board of Directors for that purpose. The minutes shall be published in the Prieta Post or on the LPR Website each month.

Article VI: Directors Section 5 Elections

Not later than October 1 of each year, a ballot containing the names of all nominees submitted by the Nominating Committee and by nominating petitions shall be posted onto the secured section of the LPR-PCA website. The ballot can be cast online or the ballot can be printed out and mailed. Each member (Active, Family-Active, Affiliate, Associate and Life) shall be eligible to vote and must enter their individual PCA membership number on each ballot (electronic or paper version) to verify membership. Only eligible ballots cast online or received by mail by midnight October 31st of each year shall be considered to meet the requirements and to be counted. The ballot shall clearly state the deadline requirement and the mailing address if the member decides to mail in their vote. A printed version of the ballot may also be requested, from the Secretary, to be mailed to the eligible member. Any member wishing to use an individual ballot may photocopy the ballot.

Not later than October 1 of each year, a ballot containing the names of all nominees submitted by the Nominating Committee and by nominating petitions shall be mailed within the Prieta Post to members in good standing. Ballots must be returned by mail or electronic ballot. Only eligible ballots received on or prior to midnight October 31st of each year shall be considered meeting the requirements and will be counted. The ballot shall clearly state the deadline requirement. The ballot shall carry instructions to vote for one candidate for each office. Each member (Active, Family-Active, Affiliate, Associate and Life), shall be eligible to vote. Any member wishing to use an individual ballot may photocopy the ballot. Individual PCA membership number shall be noted on each ballot to verify membership.

On or before November 5 of each year, the Secretary and at least two (2) member of the Nominating Committee not running for office shall convene to tally and certify the results. The Webmaster will email the automatically generated spreadsheet with the online votes to the Secretary. This above mentioned group will also open and count the mailed ballots. Then the online votes and mailed votes will be added together and the results certified.

On or before November 5 of each year the Secretary and at least two (2) members of the Nominating Committee not running for office, shall open, count and tally all ballots and certify the results. As soon as the results are certified, the Secretary shall notify the President who shall immediately give notice of the results of the election to all members running for office. It will be the Secretary's responsibility to notify all Presidential candidates of election results when the serving President is elected for a second term.

Les Schreiber



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
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
