

Along with the Mussers, it seems that Tony and Kris Vanacore are also frequent visitors to this winery and are also buddies of the management. Kris therefore jumped in and was seen performing numer-

ous duties, including distributing pizza to her hungry brethren. The combination of the friendliness and candor of the Bargettos along with the casual setting and atmosphere made this event seem more of an LPR GTG than a tour and that was the magic of Kathy and Johnny's concept for this event.

After everyone had eaten, the group was invited back into the winery for barrel tastings and purchases of wine. Why anyone would want to taste a barrel is beyond me, but by the time I wondered back to the winery I saw many cases of wine

being loaded into the cargo holds of our cars, indicating that the purchases were going well. So it would seem that the winery was happy with the event; all the participants seemed happy and content (all that wine and pizza for 25 bucks a couple? Incredible!); and I'm betting the Mussers went home feeling pleased and content after having put on this wonderful tour. On behalf of the Bennetts and LPR, we offer kudos and many thanks to Johnny and Kathy for your efforts.



# LPR Autocross #4

June 16th dawned the usual promised gorgeous sunny Californian day in Los Altos, but I wondered if the autocross site down at Marina Airport would be graced with the same weather. Let's be honest, it has been known to change abruptly down there to be what the English might charitably term "bloody freezing". And with this previous experience to guide us we took warm jackets. So June and I thundered south in warm sunshine, and the weather, although also beautiful and sunny at this autocross site was blowing up a gale of a cold wind there. It must have its own meteorological micro climate.



To be honest, I had forgotten the name of the road to take from Reservation Road, so I looked it up on Google Earth. Up on the screen came the familiar globe of planet earth, and on typing in "Marina Airport, CA" the globe rotated to America, then zoomed into California, then zoomed further down into Marina Airport itself. And there was the info I needed, - Imjin Road. Just for the heck of it I zoomed further into the site, and to my amazement at the time the satellite photos were taken it was obvious that an autocross was going on there. Closer examination clearly showed the cars lined up on the grid, and what looks like our own LPR autocross trailer was very plain to see with a bunch of our autocrossers milling around it. Ain't technology marvelous?

Arriving at around 10.00 a.m., June and I found the event was in full swing, Tony and Kris Vanacore being the first to greet us. Tony had about three runs already, and like all autocrossers was determined to do better on his next run. Which he did. Anne Roth was next to greet us with some of her famous brownies of mysterious recipe. She mentioned that some 56 cars were signed up, five of them simply 'drive-bys' curious to see how their cars may perform. One driver even came from San Diego to compete. Another tidbit of trivia was that of the 400 cones owned by LPR, all but ten of them were used.

This autocross site is one of the finest around, being huge, rectangular, free of lampposts, and flat. It was very obvious that Anne Roth has got this autocross organization

down to a fine art. Some might even say a science. Safety is paramount. Everything was so smoothly run that her involvement hardly seemed necessary. Everybody knew exactly what they had to do, and there were no problems of any kind. Continuous commentary from the trailer's P.A. system manned by Charlie Davis or Ed Tefankjian kept everyone informed of the times of each competitor, sometimes hard to hear above the roar of engines and squealing of tires out there on the course. The ongoing duel between Ed Tefankjian and Chris Schaut sometimes separated them by a mere decimal point or two according to the electronic timing display. An added bonus of entertainment was the skydiving taking place concurrently, the landing area of course being well away from the autocross site.

June found the whole scene so pleasant that she even wrote her own take on the event as follows.

If you have nothing better to do on a weekend when LPR is having an autocross, then grab a warm coat and drive down to Marina Airport. But I must warn you that you will be hooked and be competing at the next autocross event.

Instructors are available and will ride with you pointing out what not to do, and what to do to win. This is definitely a very competitive but friendly sport where half a second can make a difference. The cars are divided into different classes, and the camaraderie between the drivers is great.

Of course, you are apt to cheer along the drivers you know, although it's sometimes hard to recognize them with their helmets on. Ed and Chris are are always seconds within each other, and their friendly rivalry is well noted.

Tony Vanacore was really gunning it with his wife Kris cheering him on. Barry Pangrle was also doing well as Chief Instructor. One enthusiastic competitor was even keeping his tires warm by wrapping the entire car around with a large roll of insulating material. President Vince and Christina were there taking photos.

I know once you visit this site you will want to attend the next autocross, but remember your warm jacket.

Again, this could not take place without the planning of this well run event by Anne. The camaraderie of the competitors and everyone working the course makes this a grand event.
