





Beale Air Force Base Tour

fter taking over 6 months to set up, most of those signed up started showing up at the designated starting spot about noon on a beautiful Thursday. The instructions said we would leave Coco's in Dublin about 1 PM. Most made it early enough for lunch. A few folks got a little lost but finally made it and a few thought 1PM meant the start of lunch. At this point

we had 22 LPR members taking up the middle of Coco's. All in all, it started resembling a GTG right from the start.

We finally departed closer to 2PM but the "easy" drive to the Nut Tree rest stop became a scramble almost immediately. Between the traffic lights and the Benicia bridge toll lane, everyone was widely spread out, but

amazingly, we all made the Nut Tree pretty much en masse. I think I was the most lost tour leader in in a long time. I've heard stories of other fabled lost tour leaders so I take pride in the company I'm keeping. Hey, we all made it to the Yuba City Hampton Inn so it couldn't have been that bad.

After settling in and meeting up with other couples coming in from various places, we all gathered in the Inn's great room where the GTG atmosphere continued. Wine, cheese, Gin and tonics and various other delights got everyone ready for dinner. In fact, about the time the wine ran out, it was



time to assemble for the short drive to dinner.

Twenty-six strong LPR members in full GTG mood invaded Macello's Fine Italian Food and we were promptly ushered into the large party room. Probably a good thing for the 8 to 10 other customers. Les and I picked Marcello's because of their great menu and friendly owners, success. Good food, friendly service and lots of smiles. Felt like a party. Of note, everyone made it back to the hotel just fine.

Friday morning, we all managed to caravan through Yuba City, across the river and through Marysville to the South Beale gate on time. Ed Tafankjian and Larry Sharp drove up from the Bay Area in time to meet us at the gate. Rich Wyatt and the Mihalko family, George, Taylor and Andrew came all



the way from Reno to join our little tour. They hadn't been able to do the tour when the Sierra Nevada region did it and we were happy to have them join us. Don and Leslie Orlando came in from Roseville although they were a little late. Seems Don followed his GPS instead of the instructions and took a detour to the Main Gate. Knowing Don, he just wanted to do an early base tour to show off his 993 as he made his way down to the South Gate where we had to leave our cars and board the Air Force bus for the tour.

Finally, with all 34 of us now loaded up, our driver and tour guide started the Base tour.

Beale Air Force Base is home to the 9th Reconnaissance Wing of the Air Combat Command. The 9th supports our troops all over the world with reconnaissance. intelligence gathering and surveillance activities. Translating to civilian language that means spying and ground support. The cool toys they use for this mission include the U2 Dragon Lady high altitude surveillance planes, MC-12 mid and low altitude spy planes and the big Global Hawk drones. An added plus is that Beale also hosts a Police/Security Dog training facility and the mysterious 7th Space Warning Squadron. It's a very active, highly secure area and we were lucky to see almost everything there plus something we weren't suppose to see. (and I promised the sergeant we wouldn't talk about it or show any of the pictures we weren't suppose to take. So I won't)

We took in a lot during the 6 hours or so touring the base. Our host and guide, Ssgt Trujillo, described everything we saw and answered questions as best he could. "No, we can't talk about that"



was not an uncommon response but what do you expect from a spy shop. I do have to say that all the staff we met were friendly, accessible and great hosts. For this article, we only have space for the highlights so hopefully the accompanying pictures will contribute a lot. John Reed posted 72 pictures on the LPR website. If you have questions, anyone on the tour can tell you more.

The first stop on the tour was for a "Bio" break. These guys have obviously been running tours awhile.

Next stop was the K9 training squadron. Here we got to meet the trainers, see the dogs in their kennels and watch a few of the dogs do their thing. Notice I said "see" the dogs. Trust me, you do NOT want to "meet" these dogs. I particularly liked the look of anticipation on one of the dogs when he knew he was going to get to attack someone during the demonstrations. Clearly the highlight of his day!

We only got to drive by the 7th Space Warning Squadron. It's housed in a strange looking 12 story building, way out in the middle of nowhere. Very high security. Basically a very sophisticated radar station that detects sea-launched or intercontinental ballistic missiles and determines the potential number and probable destination. Plus it detects the location of earth-orbiting satellites. I won't worry about Kim Jong Un surprising us anymore.

Base Housing...not much different than a normal neighborhood and WAY better than most of us veterans remember when we were in service.

Lunch was at the base cafeteria. What can I say about a cafeteria except we needed to eat.

Our visit to the SR 71A Blackbird spy plane display was a hit. I think the pictures will show how much fun this was.



All day long we watched the U2's fly around. Never got too close however. We did get a great tour of the U2 pilots physiological preparation and testing center. Since the U2's fly very high and for very long periods of time, the pilots need to be psychologically and physiologically prepared. This takes a large support staff and specialized equipment. One example of the psychological testing we found funny was that they make potential pilots put on their pressure suits then stand facing a wall for a couple hours to see if they freak out. That's sorta how it feels flying a U2.

These U2's are the next gen plane Gary Powers was flying when shot down over the old USSR. They can fly from Beale to a target (Afghanistan for instance) and back without landing. They typically fly twice as high as commercial

airliners (above 70,000 feet). The pilot's pressure suit is the equivalent of wearing a stiff sleeping bag, with a football helmet on your head, and ski gloves that make movements difficult. Flying a U2 is like being locked in a closet for 10+ hours! Of course, the pilots are all willing volunteers!

We ended with a flight line tour of the T-38 trainers and watching the U2's do touch and gos (landing without stopping, then taking off again). On the tarmac we got a better view of the U2's. Really interesting thing is that U2's need chase cars to help them land. Another U2 pilot mans the chase car at speeds up to 100 mph, closely following a landing U2 to tell the pilot how far he/she is above the runway and how they're doing since the pilots can not see much because of their pressure suits and seating position. Thinking about it, maybe the pilots volunteer to fly U2's just so they can drive chase cars sometimes.

I was sorta disappointed that we didn't get to see the Global Hawk drones, except for quick peeks through hangar doors. These are some of the drones actively supporting our "help" in the Middle East. It has a range of more than 12,000 miles and can fly more than 34 straight hours. These guys don't carry missiles. Just spy (as far as the fact sheet states). You can see pictures and get more facts at http://www.beale.af.mil/library/factsheets/index.asp. You can tell I get into this stuff.

Anyway after the flight line stop, the tour was over and we headed back to the parking lot. Most of the tour headed their separate ways after the base tour but 12 of us stopped in Sacramento to avoid Friday traffic. We

had dinner at Crawdad's on the river enjoying a picture perfect sunset. Cocktails were good but the menu was limited and disappointing. Still a great way to finish a tour. Another rolling GTG comes to an end.







s a deep October sunset turned the sky a gorgeous orange and bronze, LPR friends gathered for a terrific Oktoberfest at the beautiful home of Jan McFarlane. 
