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EDITOR'S LETTER

The Prieta Post immediately returned to 1st place in category at Porsche Parade in the annual PCA newsletter competition in its completely new format.

You probably all know that the Post returned to digest print format after a one year absence during 2012 when the Post was only delivered in Constant Contact, a non-competitive format. I am very proud of our newsletter after completing four years as editor and receiving four awards, three first place and one second during my prior tenure as editor in 2009 (1st), 2010 (2nd), and 2011 (1st).

Three place awards are given for each PCA category. There are five categories based upon membership numbers. The top category is reserved for regions with more than 2000 members and again in Category 5, this time the Upper Canada region won the overall top award called the Betty Jo Turner award, named after the Panorama editor who retired three years ago after a very long career in PCA. Newsletter judging is like concours judging, it is done by the participants but also only done by those who have received an award. I judged Category 5 twice in the past and I can tell you that they deserve to win, most of the Category 5 newsletters look like Road & Track magazines, typically because these regions have several editors, some are often professionals in graphic arts and many contributing editors in technical fields.

We have me, Jackie my darling and most wonderful and supportive partner, and Kevin Bennett who I cannot thank enough for his support

and creative work with the photo captions and most flyers. Johnny Musser III has also been utilizing his creative skills creating flyers. I also cannot overlook our photographers, principally John Reed who will make sure I have plenty of event photos and if he cannot attend an event, which is rare, will make sure someone covers the photos and gets them to me timely and all our members who contribute the stories you read about the events every month and the technical articles. Although there is only one name on the award these members deserve credit for their contributions.

To try to keep our edge, I am adding a couple of elements to the Prieta Post. Bill Jump contributed the boundary photo, the dash of a rare '52 Glockler taken at Parade and changing up the type fonts. I am trying to key in on where the judges are giving points.

Thank you for all your support in making the Prieta Post the best in its category and especially the support you have given me through this most difficult time in my life over the past eight months.


KEN'S KORNER



On Sunday, July 20th Jim Davis and friends would like to invite you on a "Tour a La Cantina."





think this is the 8th annual Indy 500 breakfast at Moffett Field. Les gave the guards at the gates a copy of the attendance list early on Sunday so we'd have no difficulty getting in. I think it probably helps if you're driving your Porsche when you try to convince them vou're in the Porsche club, but everyone got in ok (as far as I know). Smooth

sailing across the base to the golf course where we all met to watch this year's racing spectacle.

Since Karen Morgan won all the money the past two years, we thought we'd change the recipe this year. We still require \$5 for every "bet" on a driver, but rather than holding all the money till the end, we decided to give 20% of the pool to whoever

picked the driver in the lead at the end of Lap 50, and 20% to the driver at the end of Lap 100, and Lap 150. The final 40% would go to the winner of the race.

This strategy certainly changed things! Rather than losing interest, we at least recaptured peoples' attention every 50 laps or so. I think it made for a more interesting race.

Montova's pit box was across the start/finish line, and they listed him as leading the 100th lap. Now I know he couldn't have had the lead at the end of lap 100, but the TV coverage chose that moment to run a commercial break. When coverage resumed. Rvan Hunter-Reay was in the lead (we confirmed he led at Lap 101), but no one had picked that driver!

Tradition is that if no one has picked the driver in the lead, the pool goes to whoever picked the next driver (etc. until we get a winner). As it happens, Helio Castroneves was next in line, and there were eight people who'd picked Helio.

In the end, Ryan Hunter-Reav won the race and Helio was second, so the eight who picked Helio split the pool from lap 100 plus the win...I must admit I was challenged to calculate and distribute the winnings.

The official outcome was: Barry Pangrle, Ed Tefankjian both picked Montova who led lap 50, John Reed and June Iles picked Marco Andretti who led lap 150. Ed Tefankiian, John Reed. Les Schreiber, Jim Davis, Ken & June Iles, Barry Pangrle and Bob Morgan all picked Helio Castroneves who was next behind Ryan Hunter-Reay on laps 100 and 200 but hadn't been picked by anyone...

Thanks to all who attended. Congratulations to all who won, and for the rest, there's always next year!




