





The tour, led by Bigg John and Angie with only 12 of the original 22 Porsches, glided out of the Blue Lakes Lodge parking lot and onto Hwy. 20 to begin the back roads drive to Healdsburg. The early morning fog had mostly burned off, the sun and clearing skies beckoned us to enjoy the spring foliage that surrounded our senses. Since Jacqueline and I were searching for a winery I had read about, I'll let Bigg John tell you about the tour to Healdsburg.




