Escape to Mount Rushmore

scape-- what a great name!
Everyone loves an escape FROM daily routine, even retirees like
Russ and me. Escaping TO a new place is even better. So we decided to turn the three day PCA Escape to Rushmore, headquartered at Rapid City in the Black Hills of South Dakota, into a memorable two week, almost 4000 mile round-trip road trip in our 2009 Cayenne GTS.

Highlights of our trip coming and going included:

- National and state parks and monuments such as the awe inspiring Grand Tetons and Yellowstone in Wyoming, the poignant historic reality of Little Bighorn Battlefield in Montana, the grandeur of Devils Tower in Wyoming, reminders of early pioneers' struggles at Independence Rock and along pioneer trails, colorful prairie grasses and eroded formations of South Dakota's Badlands, and wildlife in Wind Cave National Park
- Scenic, sometimes twisty Porsche roads including Logan Canyon in NW Utah, US 14 over a 9000+ foot pass through the Bighorn Mountains,

Flaming Gorge in SW Wyoming, "The Loneliest Road in America" (Nevada's Highway 50)

- Good quality roads, clean roadsides, and much less traffic than we see in our area
- The freedom to stop when we were ready with no preplanned reservations other than in Rapid City, sometimes in quirky, out-of-the-way places and other times in familiar cities: Montpelier, Idaho; Cody, Buffalo, Casper, and Rock Springs, Wyoming; Delta, Utah; Carson City, Nevada.

And then there was the actual October 1-3 Escape, a gathering of 550 people in 285 Porsches including just about every model Porsche ever made! We were especially impressed that so many people traveled so far with participants representing 38 states and five Canadian provinces. Some Porsche devotees, like Jerry and Myra Sutton from Texas (who we learned are excellent autocrossers and know a number of LPR members), attended Rennsport Reunion in Laguna Seca the

weekend prior to Escape, then drove straight to South Dakota. A couple from Saint James City, Florida won a set a tires for driving 2093 miles one way, the farthest distance anyone traveled.

Escape included the usual easy camaraderie of fellow Porsche fans plus a variety of opportunities for participation. Interested people reserved spaces for a wine tasting, drives, and tours, and sometimes just went out on their own to savor the beauty of the Black Hills. Tours of 30 cars each included twisty canyons dressed in fall colors, one lane tunnels cut through rock, pigtail bridges (google it!), Mount Rushmore, Crazyhorse, Custer State Park, northern and southern hills, and even a jewelry factory where we watched gorgeous Black Hills Gold creations being fabricated. (Some of us even splurged while there!) Drives to some of the same areas included less cars, less stops, and more spirited driving.

A people's car choice car show (with the overall winner being a gorgeous 1955 Speedster from North Dakota), accompanied by a delicious welcome buffet and party, was held at an adjoining park Thursday. The evening was punctuated by an incredible sunset!

A traditional farewell banquet Saturday included numerous door prizes and commemorative Riedel crystal wine glasses for each attendee.

Thanks to extensive planning and organizing by the host regions, the event was very enjoyable, even though we had to contend with some rain (We Californians loved it even if it did make a mess of the cars!) and fog. Views of Mount Rushmore and Crazyhorse, including being able to see the Presidents framed by the one lane tunnels, were disappointingly obscured by fog... or was it a cloud? Russ and I managed to catch views of the Rushmore carvings, thanks to a child on one of our visits who excitedly announced in the gift shop, "The Presidents are out!", causing visitors driven there by the fog to rush outside for the view. We never did see Crazyhorse. However, the visitor centers and museums at each site were well worth the visit.

After returning home, we learned that LPR Secretary Larry Sharp also attended Escape, driving his white Cayman with Martini stripes to Rapid City after

Rennsport. It turns out he enjoyed many of the same sites and sights we did! Photos accompanying this article were taken by both Larry and us. Since we have never met, it would have been nice to have a list of attendees, their regions, and the cars they were driving so we could have connected at the event.

We arrived home with a greater

appreciation for the varied scenery our country offers: rolling prairies with colorful prairie grasses, mountain passes, multicolored rock layers, high deserts, forests, and manmade wonders. Seeing wildlife not found in California was a treat: bison, prairie dogs, and pronghorn antelope. Of course experiencing all this with the comfort and high performance of a Porsche is icing on the cake!








AX 8 map. This boded for slower times. Trick or treat. Lots of ways to drive this one. The route through the middle of the Pumpkin was only 7 feet wide.



The problems at VW have now expanded to Audi and Porsche Diesels.

A number of lawsuits are being formulated which will aggravate the situation.

VW has indicated that future developments are under review for continuation, delay or cancellation. The impact on Porsche has not been indicated.

Meanwhile, affected US VW Diesel owners have been notified and

\$1000 in the form of coupons has been extended.

On a more positive note, Barron's financial had an insert dated Monday Nov 30 that was very complementary to the Cayenne Diesel. It utilzes a superior emissions system. It has a tank of urea which neutralizes the emissions while VW diesels do not. It is not clear if this meets the standards or not-more to come. The article indicated a driving range of 765 miles without a refill. Clearly this is not your AX vehicle.

Stay tuned as this evolves.


