



is the place to be at the Tudor IMSA Races at Mazda Raceway at Laguna Seca

The fog was light and burned off about 9:00 am on Saturday. Les Schreiber and I joined PCA Zone 7 Representative Paul Czopek and a host of other volunteers to help staff the PorschePlatz (Porsche Place in German) and Porsche-only Parking Corral at edge of turn 5 at Laguna Seca on May 2 & 3. Some of us were helping club members park their cars in an orderly fashion, while Sharon Neidel and others manned the sign-in table inside the very comfortable tent. Saturday at noon would be the opportunity of a lifetime for 46 drivers as they had the track all to themselves for a couple of Laps. Jim Davis, Les Schreiber (with Bill Highley as co-driver), Chris Stocker and his pal Larry, all got to do the Porsche Parade Laps. The first time through the corkscrew is a thrilling experience.

There were qualification runs for all classes throughout the day, and actual races for two of the single-marque groups like the MAZDA challenge class, made up entirely of Mazda Miata's, sounding like a bunch of angry hornets as they stormed around the track. Next came the Lamborghini Super Trofeo, the race for only Lambo's, whose mighty V-10 engines provided a more basso profundo chorus. There were also races for the Continental Tire Sportscar Challenge pitting Porsche Cayman against BMW, Nissan and others in the ST (Street Tuner) class, and 911's raced with Camaro's, Mustang's, Corvettes, and Ferrari's in the GS (Gran Sport) class. It was exciting racing, with the fastest 911 placing just off the podium in 4th after the winning Camaro Z/28, a Mustang Boss 302, and a Nissan 370Z. Mazda swept the podium in the ST class with the fastest Cayman placing 8th.

I returned to Laguna Seca on a foggier Sunday hoping that Porsche could fare better with the factory team entries. Sunday's race was the Tudor United Sportscar Championship race. The format for this race is similar to a Le Mans race where all four classes are racing simultaneously (making for some very challenging racing). The fastest cars were the Unlimited Prototypes, then the Challenger Prototypes which have more restrictions (intended to control costs). The GTLM class is where the factory Porsche 911 RSR's #911 & #912 were positioned near the front of their class at the start. The GTD class is a Pro-Am class giving professional and amateur drivers both the opportunity to race. Porsche did better in these races, reaching the podium in GTLM (finishing 3rd and 5th respectively), and grabbing 2 podium spots in GTD, a 1st and 3rd, with an Audi between in 2nd.
