

March 28 saw 61 auto crossers kick off LPR PCA's 2015 auto cross season.

The weather was about as good as it gets in Marina, with moderate temperatures and very light breeze.

Most autocross stories start with the battle for Top Time of Day, and this one is no exception. Dave Dunwoodie was "Scratch Time King" with times in the 36 and 37 second range, marred by pylons up until run number 8, a 37.2 effort. By this time, Mike Koozmin's 914-6 GT had logged four clean 36's, the fastest a 36.3. Dave D. would finally clock a clean 36.756 in his 1970 911 to win M 03, and

Mikey "Z" would lower his best to 36.259 for TTOD honors and take the M 02 win.

Trevor Ridgley and Grant Keyser had a good battle in street driven cars, with Trevor R.'s 911 GT3 just over a second behind Dave D.'s in M03. His 37.959 was just over 0.8 ahead of I 03 winner Grant K's 2010 Cayman S.

The real battle of the Caymans seemed to be in class P 08. Larry Sharp pulled ahead of Chris Schaut on third runs, 40.0 to 40.7. Chris S. was one to watch, though, as he had a dirty 40.3 on his second run. Could he make one count? Larry S. could only lower his time to 39.870, but Chris S. could never better that 40.785 third run. Charles Prooth's Cayman was third and Joseph Yau was fourth in a 2009 Carrera.



Auto crossing in general seems to be dominated by newer cars, but classic Porsches at LPR events are well represented. Improved 01 was a battle between

Joe Lee and John Eiskamp in 912's and Brian Harney in a 914-4. Joe Lee set the mark on run number two with a 42.8, after a big spin on run number one. Joe L. was able to re-set the bar several more times, finally settling in with a 41.601. Brian H. was able to get down to 43.562 in afternoon runs, and John E. was third at 47.288. We'll be watching John-for improvement. John is a relative

newcomer to auto crossing.

Between morning and afternoon run groups, eleven runs were offered, and the Dave D. course was very well received. Workers were offered snacks, including the famous Anne Roth brownies. Anyone considering trying autocross will find LPR to be a very friendly place to play!

It would be hard to find someone whom you could say is more local to the East Bay than Jim Davis. He was born in East Oakland and spent his entire childhood there. Upon graduating high school in Oakland, and after being courted by USC, Nebraska and Florida, among others, Jim accepted a full ride baseball scholarship to U.C. Berkeley. While there, he tried out for the football team and proved so valuable to the squad that the head coach, Marv Levy, arranged to have his scholarship switched to the football program. A draft notice interrupted college, so Jim spent two years in the Marine Corps working as a recruiter. After returning to Berkeley to finish school, Jim was recruited to the Oakland Raiders for practice squad duty by a former U.C. Berkeley assistant coach then working with the Raiders. Paralleling the plot of the movie Rudy, Jim's enthusiasm and work ethic unexpectedly landed him a spot on the team's roster as the team rolled to two

Super Bowl victories in the 1980s. Jim played one year with the Buffalo Bills to end his pro football days and then it was back to his beloved East Bay where he spent the rest of his working career as business rep for the Teamsters Union.



He was fortunate in grandparents living having walking distance who provided him with support and guidance such that he was able to focus on school and sports. His grandfather promised to provide a college education to Jim and his three brothers, and when Jim got his full ride scholarship, gramps had to come up with an alternative reward. It was 1975 and Jim came home one day to find his grandfather there with a spanking new, red Porsche 911 Carrera parked out front. What made the gift viable was that the dealership was set up to maintain the car for Jim while billing his grandfather.

So, off to Berkeley Jim drove in his heartthrob of a car. He lived on campus and, incredible as it seems, just left the car parked out at night. He never had any problems but, interestingly, he said that whenever he went home to visit, he left the car on campus and took the bus. That ritual indicates something about his home Oakland neighborhood.

Jim joined the Porsche Club of America in 1976 and said that this dalliance with Golden Gate Region lasted only 6 months. It was well over thirty-five years before he met Les Schreiber and discovered Loma Prieta Region. He admits that now, like many of us, LPR is his primary social outlet.

And that '75 Carrera? He still has it. He did a restoration on it a few years back; repaint, a new interior and an engine rebuild. During the restoration, the subject of the original-equipment eight-track player was considered. Much to Jim's credit, he elected to retain it, keeping the car in stock condition. 
