A Day at AX 6

Yes! Sometimes cones are down. On course workers hustle to reset cones struck as a driver headed for the finish line

A 6 was attended by about 50 drivers. This was an interesting day for me as I had a great AX ride with Ed "Racer". That gave me a lot of perspective on the performance of the cars and the skill of the drivers. Autocross driving is demanding and the cars are tested for sure. Most drivers are LPR Porsche owners, with some from GGR, Monterey, and Redwood Region in the mix. Then there are the other breeds- Vettes, Miatas, BMWs, VWs, dune buggies and non street legal race cars.

Here is a typical chronology through the day at an autocross event>

Prior to the event here is what happens:

The participants sign up for the event and a course layout is provided for review. The objective is 12 runs in the event for each driver, depending on course length and number of drivers. The cars are entered in a class that takes into account the model and modifications for handling & performance.

On the day of the event preparation begins to set up the course:

At about 7 am the trailer arrives, then it is time to go to work on set up. The generator is fired up and connected for power to the trailer. The green cones, orange cones, timing gear, and the registration table that need to

be outside the trailer are unloaded. The green cones lining the entry lane belong to Marina Motorsport and are there 24/7. The timing gear is set up. The registration table is readied. Registration begins at 7:30 and runs until 8:30. Water and snacks are available at the registration table. The drivers are divided into two groups at registrationinitially one group works on the course, the others drive then later they reverse duties. The cones are set up and then placement is fine tuned for safety. Then the course is chalked to stripe the lanes. The course entry area is sometimes swept to remove rock chips. Drivers walk the course for additional familiarity of the course setup. Green cones on the course mark apexes and orange cones mark the lane boundaries.

The trailer is set up for audio communications, booking lap times. During operations 3 people are manning the trailer for announcements and recording times.

Drivers further prep their car to unload unnecessary weight, tune up tire pressure, tape their cars on both sides with visible numbers, and some change from street tires to track tires. Then the tech inspection occurs to clear the cars for safety. The drivers meeting is called to review the rules- safety is paramount.

After the drivers meeting, workers check

into their stations. During the runs they reset downed cones and monitor safety out on the course.

For the drivers the start layout is formed as a "chevron". The cars will be dispatched by a pacer manning the chevron to enter the queue. The cars line up on grid as dispatched. Driving is targeted to start around 9:15. The starter paces cars entry to the course with the wave of a green flag at the start gate. The general rule is no more than 3 cars on the course at any one time, and they are paced at a safe distance from each other. If a cone is down or displaced from its position one of the crew in the course repositions the cone after it is safe to do so.

The down cone counter is stationed outside of the trailer and relays the number cones killed by each driver to the trailer for scoring (one second deducted for each downed cone). After the finish line is crossed most drivers snap their head over to see their lap time on the large display positioned near the trailer. At the finish line a timing slip is handed to the driver. The trailer announces finish times to the course. Cars that go off course are Did Not Finish (DNF) for that run.

Around noon there is a break for lunch. After a lunch break the action resumes around 1pm. The participants reverse roles.

At the end of on course operations, it is time to pick up the cones and the equipment to put it back in the trailer. The end of the day varies- usually around 3-4 PM. Consider that with 50 cars and a target of 12 runs each that is 600 runs- a busy place. Typical fastest runs vary from around 30 seconds to 45 seconds that your editor has seen in two events.

After the event, scoring is tabulated by class. After crunching the data it is posted to LPRs website.

This year LPR had 7 weekends, including one two day event. For the two day event LPR sponsors one day and GGR sponsors the other day. In those events the drivers get points for LPR or GGR and Zone 7. Summary: lots of action, a very busy place and a vital part of LPR. The biggest surprise to me has been the ability of the 914's and the skill of their drivers vs new vintage more powerful 911's.

You can take a ride as a passenger with a certified AX instructor. You will wear a protective helmet just like the drivers do. I guarantee that you will find it exhilarating. You will come away with a higher degree of respect for the capability of your Porsche and admire the skill of the driver who took you on that ride. You should come down and "JUST DO IT".





Some key Porsche brand news compiled by Bill Jump

ne of the most important headlines re VW broke Friday September 18 when VW admitted that it had embedded software that detected emissions testing leading to falsified results of its diesel engines emission in the US. Since then VW has admitted that the Eurozone results were also invalid, the VW CEO has resigned, the stock has dropped about 30% as of 9/24 and all VW diesel car sales are on hold at least in the US. On Friday 9/25 the Porsche CEO, Matthias Mueller, took the reigns as head of VW. For perspective-VW produces around 11M vehicles annually. Porsche contributes 190K vehicles and almost 45% of the profit of the company. This has the potential to affect the investment of future vehicles such as the Porsche eCar as some \$18B is the estimated impact of the problem. Criminal charges are possible in wake of the scandal. 
