alling all Porsche drivers- your LPR Autocross course beckons. This article will better acquaint non Autocross drivers with the event, participants and the ones that make it possible. The clock is ticking and the races are rolling by fast in 2015. There are only two more events in the LPR Autocross 2015 series plus one with GGR.

First, you should know that there are Autocross schools to prep you for the experience. Safety is paramount and the requirements for entering are well documented to protect you as you negotiate the course. There is also instruction to assist making you faster and better on the course. Take note that this will make you a superior driver on the road as well.

The 2015 season consists of 8 events, all held in Marina. Each contestant makes 12 clocked runs with the objective of zero down cones. In the July 18 event (AX #5) there were 50 participants with a wide range of vehicles and skill levels of drivers. Next month we'll look back at AX #6 held on August 23. A dual event is planned for September 12 & 13 with GGR. The final event of the season is AX #8 planned for October 25.

After check-in one of the most important steps occurs- the safety inspection. Don't come unprepared by failing the safety inspection. Here is a link to the nuts and bolts of that > https://youtu.be/wcK6_HFgnSo

A wide range of models make their appearance, scored by class. Here is a sample of models from AX5 > 911 of many stripes from 1974-2015 911 GT2, GT3, GT3 RS4 912 914 944S Boxster S Cayman S, R, GTS Macan Turbo Cavenne S Plus a Vette, Golf R, Mazda MX-5 GT, BMW M3, and 325i, You may even see Dunebuggies and a VW Beetle as well as other ilk.





Take Highway 1 south toward Monterey and Laguna Seca Raceway. Take the Reservation Road exit south toward Marina. After one short block, turn right in order to stay on Reservation Road. Follow the road through Marina approximately two miles south of town. Turn left at (Imjin Road) signal into Marina Airfield. Turn right after the first large building on the right and follow the cones to the autocross site.
