I watched a TV show recently entitled "The History of Comedy". It appears to be a series and this first episode was on the evolution of acceptance by our society



When most everyone was finished there was some commotion and a group of wait-




The last time I saw a tour stopped like this, a half dozen drivers were cited for having no front license plates.


