On March 11th of this year there was another major controversy created when an unarmed young black man, Stephon Clark, was shot and killed in his grandparent's Sacramento backyard. Police had responded to a complaint in the area that someone was breaking windows. Purportedly, a police helicopter spotted Clark in a different backyard breaking a sliding glass door and directed patrol officers to his location while tracking his movements from the air. A foot pursuit resulted in two officers following Clark onto his grandparent's property where the two officers fired 20 shots, ten each, killing him. Body cam videos have audio with one officer yelling, "Gun, gun, gun..." prompting the emptying of their pistol clips with the subsequent revelation that Clark was merely holding his cell phone.

As an elderly, basically conservative white man, it is easy to take a simplistic view of this event and conclude that Clark precipitated his own demise by fleeing from the police, but with so much publicity over these shootings, one can't help wondering why so many black men keep getting shot while defying police authority.

A little known fact: In absolute numbers there are more unarmed white men shot and killed by the police than black, which points to a trend that I have touched on in the past; there is a strong tendency in this country for individuals to confront, and even defy, policemen in the execution of their perceived duty. A study showed that over a two year period from May 2013 to April 2015, roughly 49 percent of those killed in police shootings were white, while 30 percent were black. The problem is that blacks represent only 12% of the population, thereby making their representation in this statistic disproportionately high; seemingly proof of racism and thereby a validation of their indignation over these killings.

Disparate forces seem to be at work here. Not being black and having never been conscious of being discriminated against, I can only intellectualize about the effects of discrimination against an individual. But I do know that there are blatant examples of rac-

ism, probably often encountered in the cauldron of social cruelty called adolescence, and I can imagine that it takes very few instances of such to begin enraging an individual at the slightest perception of injustice. High unemployment among black youth puts them in a possible position of idling in public where they have a greater likelihood of interacting with police, which in almost no instance is likely to create a positive impression and highly likely to leave a feeling of ill will.

On the law enforcement side is a clearly tough job. When patrolling a predominantly white neighborhood, stopping someone for a DWB (driving while black) may yield a few results, but it is lazy police work and certainly bad from a public relations point of view. But law enforcement will argue that watching for people and things that are out of place is part and partial of detecting and deterring crime, and they have a point... so the job gets tougher. I can't help wondering though, in this tough and frustrating job, when you chase a suspect down a dark alley... nerves on edge knowing that you are putting your own life at risk... the suspect complicating things by fleeing... sweating profusely with your heart pumping a mile a minute as adrenaline courses through your body, is there some inclination, no matter how slight, to get even with the guy that put you in this situation and be a little trigger happy?

It is highly unlikely that society will ever be able to keep these deadly encounters from happening because there is little chance of holding a policeman to account for a shooting thanks to a Supreme Court decision written by Chief Justice William Rehnquist. In it he specified that the justification for a police shooting has to be evaluated on what was in the mind of the officer at the very second that he pulled the trigger. It cannot be judged with the advantage of 20-20 hindsight. In the case of Stephon Clark, the fact that one officer shouted "Gun, gun, gun," immediately prior to firing would seemingly make them immune to any form of prosecution, and, interestingly, a charge of racism may not even hold up as there is no indication that the officers knew that Clark was black; the citizen reporting the breaking glass just indicated that it was a man wearing a hoodie.

There are some who are advocating that police be held to absolute responsibility for their actions. If they shoot an unarmed man, they should be tried for murder. This idea seems nonsensical and

would create a police force that would operate in lockstep with the four sheriff's deputies who refused to enter the building while the shooting was taking place in the Parkland, Florida school. It would literally be a race among law enforcement to see who could be last to confront or apprehend a suspect.

It was thought that body cameras were going to be the panacea for holding officers accountable for shooting unarmed suspects, but the footage from the Stephon Clark incident would appear to do the opposite, locking in the perception of at least one officer at the very moment of firing that thought he saw a gun. With over 200 million privately owned firearms in the U.S. it would seem that disarming of the citizenry is, at best, unlikely and, therefore, disarming law enforcement would be impossible.

Better parenting may be the best long-term solution: teaching children the value of being polite and respectful of authority to, as un-American as it sounds, avoid being shot by police. It would be great, too, if at the same time they could teach our youth that we are all equal under the skin and that the positives of tolerance far outweigh any possible benefits of prejudice and hate.
