

EASY, aka; European Auto Salvage Yard has been one of best places to find Porsche parts for 40 years. Jim Breazeale opened the shop in 1978, in Emeryville, back when there were lots of wrecked and unloved Porsche to find. Back then you could buy a 356 for a few hundred dollars, find parts in wrecking yards, and find people to work on them. In the early '70s, new parts for 356s were not readily available from the dealerships, there was no internet, no eBay and





very few other shops specialized in old Porsche parts. Jim's knowledge of what will work, what is correct and where to find things has helped countless Porsche owners with their repairs and restorations.

In more recent years, the supply of parts cars and stashes of good parts have become harder to find as the cars once thought of as junk are now being restored. EASY started to stock the more available parts cars: 914s, 924/944/968s, and 911s.

When Jim announced that he was going to retire and sell the building, everybody wondered what was going to happen to the





parts. Rod and Gary Emory have agreed to take the parts for their inventory at Parts Obsolete in Oregon and Emory Motorsports in North Hollywood .

The EASY sponsored Coffee and Cars, and Donuts semi-monthly event has been going on for a number of years on the 1st and 3rd Saturdays, 9 a.m. to noon of most months. It has grown into a huge gathering with enthusiasts for all models Porsches, and many Porsche oriented groups represented. Some attendees travelled long distances





just to hang out in Harlan Street for an EASY Saturday morning. The February 3rd gathering was the last one that EASY will sponsor and host, and as a fitting tribute, there were hundreds of Porsches and lots of EASY fans to say farewell. Cars started arriving at 8 a.m., and by 8:30 the street was filled with 3 lines of Porsches. By 9:30 cars filled most of the surrounding blocks and were still coming in.


